- Country Specific Recommendations





# **ESF minimum share** for the first time in the history of cohesion policy

- 23.1% ESF minimum share
- Rationale: ensure MS have sufficient resources to achieve the employment, social and education targets and objectives of Europe 2020
- Earmarking for social inclusion: 20% at national level





#### The social inclusion strand of ESF

- The general approach in the new ESF regulation is to have a horizontal focus.
  - mainstreaming
  - not explicit focus on any groups
- Only exception is marginalised groups where there is an explicit targeting though not exclusive.





# **Current state of play - general**

### After the entering into force of the ESF regulation Member States are preparing their

- 1. Partnership Agreements
- 2. Operational programmes

#### For the new programming period

- 16 Partnership Agreements have been adopted and the rest is expexted to be adopted before the end of 2014
- For the OPs 8 have been adopted (yesterday afternoon) and negotiations are ongoing between the Commission and the Member States/managing authorities for the rest.





#### The focus on Roma in the 2014-2020 ESF

The link to the CSR implies that 5 Member States are expected to focus on Roma in their Operational Programmes

In addition other countries might choose to focus on Roma in their Programmes





#### Focus in the CSRs 2014 in relation to Roma

- For most of the 5 countries with a CSR mentioning Roma (Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Hungary, Romania and Slovakia) the recommendation is to improve the access to inclusive education/pre-school/early childhood
- For Romania Roma peoples access to the labour market has been assessed as a challenge to tackle.





# The main picture for the CSR countries

#### The main picture for the CSR countries:

- Mixture of mono and multi funds
- There is a mixture of direct targeting under IP 9ii marginalised communities including Roma and mainstreaming
- When there are more OPs where Roma is targeted they are often complementary
- Most of the OPs are using an integrated approach
- The chosen approach is in many cases holistic
- In many cases when there were good practices in 2007-2013, the new programmes build on that experience





# The main picture for the CSR countries

- Most are tageting inclusion of Roma children in schools where the targeting is
  - for pre-school children
  - For school children (prevention of early school leaving)
  - For continued education
  - Capacity building for parents
  - Capacity building for teachers
- Focus on access to health services
- Targeting entrepreneurship including social entreprises
- Focus on increasing employability through individualised counselling
- Awareness raising for Roma communities about their rights





# The main picture for the other countries

- Many actions are an inclusive part of support to marginalised communities and Roma with focus on training to increase employability and probability to get a job
- Many are tageting entrepreneurship including social entreprises
- Support to health services both aimed at Roma population and professionals
- Awareness raising to combat stereotyping and discrimination
- Focus on social housing
- In some countries there is a need to create facilities like
  - Public baths
  - Mobile units for people to leave in
  - Language training to ensure integration

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
